attractions, from a life-size Columbian Mammoth to an escapable jail cell.

After visiting the welcome center, head to **Cheyenne** — Wyoming's state capital. Rich with history from its development along the tracks of the Union Pacific Railroad in the mid-1800s, it's home to numerous museums and the world's largest outdoor rodeo, **Cheyenne Frontier Days** (July 17–26, 2015).

WHEATLAND TO GLENDO STATE PARK


Continue north on I-25 on your way through **Wheatland**. Recreational opportunities abound in the area, including golfing, fishing and boating. Stop by the **Oregon Trail Ruts National Landmark** on your way to **Fort Laramie National Historic Site**. Carved into stone, these wagon ruts tell the stories of thousands of emigrants following the Oregon Trail in the mid-1800s. Fort Laramie, established as a fur-trading post in 1835 and revamped into a military post to protect trail travelers, was the first important stopping point for emigrants in Wyoming and also witnessed the Indian resistance.

GLENDO STATE PARK TO CASPER

After your trip to the past in Fort Laramie, it's time to get wet and wild at **Glendo State Park**. Boaters, anglers and swimmers enjoy its sandy beaches and clear waters.

Charming small towns fill the next two spots on this route. **Douglas** is home to the mythical jackalope. According to legend, after hunting some jackrabbits with his brother, Douglas Herrick took one to a taxidermy shop. As the rabbit lay near mule deer horns, inspiration hit Herrick, who mounted the crossbred critter.


The Laramie Mountains and Medicine Bow National Forest surround **Glenrock**, making it a perfect hub for fishing, camping and mountain biking. As you leave Glenrock, don't forget to stop by the **Ayers Natural Bridge**, just five miles off I-25. A remarkable natural bridge over La Prele Creek, the site is considered one



CHEYENNE TO WHEATLAND

Follow along the old Park to Park Highway, a popular early 1900s automobile route that connected several national parks in the West.

Start your trek at the Wyoming state line on I-25 near Cheyenne, and watch for Exit 4. Jump off to visit the new **South-east Wyoming Welcome Center**. The center gives a taste of only-in-Wyoming



of Wyoming's first tourist attractions and offers a beautiful spot for a picnic.

CASPER TO THERMOPOLIS

Located in the center of the state, **Casper** is Wyoming's adventure capital and second largest city. Casper is a mecca for world-class fly fishing on the North Platte River and won't disappoint eager anglers. While there, visit the National Historic Trails Interpretive Center, commemorating the pioneers who traveled westward in the state's early days.

From Casper, deviate from I-25 and go northwest on Hwy 20. Known as one of Wyoming's best walleye and trout fisheries, **Boysen State Park** is surrounded by the Wind River Indian Reservation. The reservoir is warm enough for all water sports and has an easily accessible swimming beach. Beginning in the town of Shoshoni nearby, the Wind River Canyon Scenic Byway puts you face to face with the windswept west as you drive through vertical rock walls rising 2,500 feet.

THERMOPOLIS TO CODY

At your next stop in **Thermopolis**, you'll find a menu of things to do, from horseback riding, golfing and whitewater rafting to the Wyoming Dinosaur Center. At the edge of town is **Hot Springs State Park**, built around the world's largest single-mineral hot springs — a perfect spot for a mid-road-trip soak. The nearby **Legend Rock Petroglyph Historic Site** invites visitors to view more than 300 petroglyphs spanning thousands of years.

CODY TO YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK

Northwest of Thermopolis is the town of **Cody**, named after the famous Colonel William F. "Buffalo Bill" Cody. Known as the preferred gateway to Yellowstone, you'll experience nightly summer rodeos, gunfight re-enactments and historic factoids at the Buffalo Bill Center of the West and the Museum of the Old West at Old Trail Town, where the lifestyle and history of the Frontier West is preserved

through a rare collection of authentic structures and furnishings.

Toward the end of the route, veer onto the **Buffalo Bill Cody Scenic Byway**, which starts about 25 miles west of Cody at the Shoshone National Forest border. This byway follows the north fork of the Shoshone River through the scenic Wapiti Valley to the east entrance of **Yellowstone National Park**, the nation's first national park and your final destination. Visit iconic spots like Old Faithful, Lower Falls and Yellowstone Lake while catching a glimpse of Yellowstone's legendary wildlife.

ROCKIES TO TETONS

ROUTE OVERVIEW


Stops: 30

Distance: About 469 miles

Start: Pine Bluffs

End: Yellowstone National Park, Jackson and Grand Teton National Park

Estimated drive time: 7.75 hours



This route traces a path between two of the most iconic and majestic mountain ranges in the United States:

The Rockies and Tetons. Wind through Wyoming and experience the recreational and historical activities provided by this contoured land.

PINE BLUFFS TO LARAMIE

As you start out in the southeast corner of the state, pass through the **Pine Bluffs Information Center** on your way to the capital city of **Cheyenne**. Rich with history, Cheyenne housed a depot for the Union Pacific Railroad in 1867 and is now home to several memorable museums, local restaurants and the world-famous Cheyenne Frontier Days.



Continuing west on I-80 you'll take a quick detour to **Curt Gowdy State Park**. The Laramie Mountains offer a stunning backdrop for outdoor enthusiasts, especially mountain bikers looking to single-track its epic trails. Nearby is **Vedauwoo Campground and Recreation** area — another great place for rock climbers, hikers and campers.

LARAMIE TO RAWLINS

You'll get back on I-80 to head toward the town of **Laramie**. Home to the University of Wyoming, Laramie is a popular spot for recreation throughout the year, from fishing to skiing. The town is also home to the University of Wyoming Geological Museum and the American Heritage Center.

Next, travel along the **Snowy Range Scenic Byway**, open and clear of snow from late spring through mid-November. This byway starts in historic Centennial (known as the gateway to the Snowies) and crosses the Medicine Bow Mountain Range, showing off more than 29 miles of Medicine Bow-Routt National Forest splendor.


Detour on your way to Rawlins and stop at **Seminole State Park** just north of I-80. The park is surrounded by giant, white sand dunes and is home to thousands of pronghorn antelopes. It also features the Seminoe Mountains, Seminoe Reservoir and the famed "Miracle Mile" of the North Platte River, one of the most bountiful fishing spots in the state.

RAWLINS TO LANDER

The town of **Rawlins** dates back to when tracks were first laid for the Union Pacific Railroad in Wyoming. It's the center of a thriving sheep and cattle industry and is best known for the **Wyoming Frontier Prison**. Known as the "Old Pen," this museum is said to be haunted with history.

A break from the interstate will take you on Hwy 287 to the **South Pass City Historic Site**. Located north of the historic Oregon Trail, South Pass City was built in 1867 during the gold-mining boom. When the Carissa Mine struck a rich vein, the town's population quickly rose to 2,000 people.

Before heading into the town of Lander, stop at **Sinks Canyon State Park**. Sinks features a unique geologic phenomenon where the Popo Agie River vanishes into a large cavern (the Sinks) and then reappears in a trout-filled pool (the Rise), about a half mile down the canyon. **Lander** is located at the base of the Wind River Mountain Range and has several ways for you to stretch your legs: from mountain climbing, trout fishing and miles of hiking trails to the fantastic Beaver Creek cross-country skiing trail system.



LANDER TO RIVERTON

A short distance from Lander to the northeast is the town of **Riverton**. Riverton is home to the 1838 Mountain Man Rendezvous, a gathering of Native Americans, fur trappers and mountain men. You'll find contests of skill (tomahawk throws, shooting, skinning), trading, tall tales, re-enactments, camping and other spirited fun. Test your own modern-day skills at the **Wind River Casino** just outside of Riverton. During the summer months, the casino hosts a weekly Northern Arapaho Experience, where traditional dances are performed.

RIVERTON TO DUBOIS

Next up is **Dubois**, the perfect Old West town. Stop at the **National Bighorn Sheep Interpretive Center**. The center tells the story of one of Wyoming's signature animals — the Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep.

DUBOIS TO YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK

From Dubois, head to the **Moran Junction** on Hwy 26, where you can choose your final destination: Jackson, Grand Teton National Park or Yellowstone National Park. **Jackson** is home to the National Elk Refuge, which provides a safe haven for thousands of elk each winter. Jackson Hole Mountain Resort is famous for its skiing, but summer months are wonderful for outdoor activities, the arts and a mouth-watering dining scene. **Grand Teton National Park's** postcard-worthy peaks are very popular among climbers, hikers and photographers. The exposed jagged rocks give these mountains their dramatic appearance in any season. **Yellowstone National Park** has served for generations as a sort of living museum, its natural splendors giving visitors an up-close-and-personal glimpse of what the continent was like in the days before recorded history.

SALT TO STONE

ROUTE OVERVIEW

Stops: 30

Distance: About 279 miles

Start: Evanston

End: Yellowstone National Park

Estimated drive time: 5.5 hours



EVANSTON TO KEMMERER

If you're headed into Wyoming from the southwest corner, the preferred route is Salt to Stone, which runs northward along Wyoming's western side and ends at Grand Teton or Yellowstone national parks. Upon crossing the Wyoming state line, stop in **Evanston**, a railroad town founded in 1868. Surrounded by mountains on all sides, Evanston is a hub for fishing, hunting, hiking, mountain biking and wildlife viewing.

From Evanston head to **Bear River State Park**, where you can stop off at the visitor center to speak with locals about your travel plans. Bear River State Park is home to a small herd of bison and elk and three miles of foot trails.


Continue east on I-80 to visit **Fort Bridger State Historic Site**. Fort Bridger was originally established as an emigrant supply stop along the Oregon Trail. Visit historic buildings like the trading post and stone barracks and browse through the museum and gift shops.

Next, dip down from the town of **Green River** into **Flaming Gorge National Recreation Area**. More than 2.5 million boaters, campers, hikers, fishermen, cross-country skiers and other outdoor enthusiasts recreate here each year.

Find your way back to the interstate and exit onto Hwy 30 to the town of **Kemmerer**, which is home to two famous festivals in July: Fossil Fest and Oyster Ridge Music Festival. It's also where James Cash "JC" Penney founded his first retail store in 1902 when it was a booming mining town.

Just west of Kemmerer is **Fossil Butte National Monument**. As Wyoming's newest national monument, it contains more than 8,000 acres and protects a portion of the largest deposit of freshwater fish fossils in the world. The visitor center houses more

than 300 fossils but if that's not enough, hike one of the interpretive trails.

KEMMERER TO PINEDALE OR AFTON

Once you've stopped in Kemmerer, choose between Pinedale and Afton as your next destination.

- » **Pinedale** is nestled on the western flank of the Wind River Mountain Range. The 12-mile-long boater-and fisher-friendly Fremont Lake is just three miles from town. On your way to the lake, stop by the **Museum of the Mountain Man** for a fascinating look into life during the 1800s fur trade era.
- » **Afton** is located in a growing rural community along the banks of Swift Creek. It's home to the world's largest elk-antler arch, built in 1958 with more than 3,000 elk antlers. Locals contribute to the growing arch when elk shed their antlers each year.

ALPINE TO JACKSON HOLE

Head north from Afton to the beautiful town of **Alpine**, less than an hour away. The town is surrounded by national forest and connects to Jackson Hole by the Snake River Canyon, making it a gateway to Yellowstone and Grand Teton national parks. Alpine is known as a headquarters for water sports on the nearby **Palisades Reservoir**, and with many streams and three rivers converging in the town of Alpine, the fishing is among the best in Wyoming.

It's a remarkable drive from Alpine northeast to Jackson — one you'll be glad to take again and again. The **Jackson Hole** area is encompassed by craggy mountain barriers. It's a beautiful spot for outdoor recreation and wildlife watching. Before heading into Yellowstone and Grand Teton national parks, stop in Jackson to sample world-class dining or ride the tram up Jackson Hole Mountain Resort's slopes, which satisfy powder-hungry skiers each winter.

JACKSON HOLE TO YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK

Grand Teton National Park shelters stunning mountain scenery and a diverse array of wildlife. Rising more than 7,000 feet above the valley of Jackson Hole, the Teton Range dominates the park's skyline. The range is very popular among climbers, hikers and photographers.


Yellowstone National Park has more than 2 million acres of sprawling wilderness to explore, including the world-famous Old Faithful geyser. The park's vast network of trails takes hikers to hundreds of secluded places where nature is left to its own devices.



BLACK TO YELLOW

ROUTE OVERVIEW

From the Black Hills to Yellowstone National Park, this route takes you from the iconic Devils Tower west toward Yellowstone National Park. Along the way you'll get up close and personal with many of Wyoming's most distinctive geological features.


SUNDANCE TO GILLETTE

Crossing over the state line from South Dakota, your first Wyoming stop will be the **Vore Buffalo Jump**. One of the most important archaeological sites of the late-prehistoric Plains Indians, the Vore is a natural sinkhole that was used as a bison trap from about 1500 to 1800. Then, stop at the **Northeast Wyoming Welcome Center** in Beulah (exit 199) for interactive displays and trip ideas from the knowledgeable staff.

Travel from the welcome center to **Devils Tower National Monument**. In 1906, Teddy Roosevelt named the tower the United States' first national monument. It looms more than 1,200 feet above Wyoming's eastern plains and the Belle Fourche River. Take time to hike along the natural trails surrounding the monument and try to spot rock climbers scaling its columns.

GILLETTE TO BUFFALO

After Devils Tower, head to the **Campbell County Rockpile Museum** in Gillette. Gillette's natural resources make the area a key player in supplying en-

ergy around the world. Visit the museum to understand the history and culture of this thriving county. Take time for a free coal mine tour or see what events are happening at the **CAM-PLEX Multi-Event Facilities**, which hosts theater, rodeos and more.

BUFFALO TO SHERIDAN OR WORLAND

Tucked away between the rolling plains of the Old West and the towering peaks of the Bighorn Mountains, **Buffalo** (one hour west of Gillette) is a perfect spot to explore wide-open spaces with a bike, boat or your two feet. Indulge in a wide variety of restaurants in town from laid-back family fare to fine dining. Buffalo will serve as your fork in the road to decide between Sheridan and Worland as your next destination.

» If you head northwest into **Sheridan**, you'll experience the "King of Cowboy Towns." With more than 70 buildings in its National Historic District, Sheridan's Main Street is where the charm of the Old West meets a vibrant modern community.

» Get off I-90 to Hwy 14 toward Lovell. Take a detour once you reach Lovell to see the **Bighorn Canyon National Recreation Area**. Known as the land that time forgot, geologic forces have distorted and bowed once-level rock layers into 1,000-foot cliffs that loom over Bighorn Lake.

» Heading southwest will take you to the town of **Worland**. Worland is home to the Washakie Cultural Center and Museum, offering an incredible hands-on experience of life in the Bighorn Basin.

Traveling to Worland using Route 16 is recommended for motor homes or vehi-

cles that are pulling, as Route 14 through Sheridan has steep grades.

From Worland, head 40 minutes north to **Greybull**. Greybull is located at the confluence of the Bighorn and Greybull rivers. Greybull's proximity to the Bighorn Mountains makes it an accessible base camp for outdoor excursions such as fishing, horseback riding and camping.

Or, take a small detour to cruise the **Red Gulch/Alkali Scenic Byway**. This 34-mile mostly unpaved route takes you along the red sandstone Chugwater Formation. The rugged canyons, caves and steep walls were eroded by water and carved by winds.

LOVELL TO CODY

Whichever route you choose, you'll end up in the town of **Lovell**, where rose gardens abound. Here you'll find easy access to Bighorn Mountain National Forest and the **Pryor Mountain Wild Horse Range**. Wild mustangs that descended from the horses of 16th-century Spanish Conquistadors make up wild herds that roam the canyons and ridges of the range. Observing these elegant, beautiful animals in an unrestrained, natural setting is something you won't want to miss.

Stop in **Powell** as you continue your path toward Yellowstone. Located in the heart of the Bighorn Basin, Powell is surrounded by the Bighorn Pryor and Absaroka mountain ranges. While you're in the area, take time to visit the **Heart Mountain Interpretive Center**, the site of a WWII-era Japanese American Internment camp.

CODY TO YELLOWSTONE

Continue west to the town of **Cody**, where you'll experience outdoor adventure, from rock climbing to fly fishing and horseback riding. Three scenic byways


(go to page 156 for more information) in the area offer opportunities to view wildlife and the landscape that makes this part of Wyoming awe inspiring. While in Cody, a must-see is the **Buffalo Bill Center of the West**. The center celebrates the spirit of the American West with history, local lore and native culture.

You'll pass the Buffalo Bill Reservoir on Hwy 14 on your way to the east entrance of **Yellowstone National Park**. With more than 2 million acres of sprawling wilderness to explore, Yellowstone stands as one of North America's greatest assets. The iconic spots — Old Faithful, Lower Falls and Yellowstone Lake — will be familiar from paintings and photographs, but seeing them in person is a humbling experience.

NATIONAL PARKS



The northwest corner of Wyoming is truly one of those places everyone should see at least once — and the fortunate will visit again and again. For more than a century, people have traveled here from all over to see some of America's most cherished natural wonders. With the promise of postcard-worthy vistas, amazing wildlife and outdoor adventures in a beautiful, rugged setting, a visit to Grand Teton and Yellowstone national parks has come to define the quintessential American vacation. And today, the same pristine, breathtaking landscape of mountains, lakes, waterfalls, forests and geysers — not to mention a plethora of wildlife — still beckons to those who crave nature, serenity, adventure and a classic getaway unlike any other.



ESSENTIALS

- » Dining options range from cafeterias to fine restaurants throughout the parks.
- » Guides and outfitters in nearby towns such as Jackson, Cody and Dubois often offer adventures in the parks. Find them on page 70.
- » Lodging in the parks ranges from campgrounds to lovely, historic lodges, and your best bet is to book early. Use the listings starting on page 124 to find campgrounds and other accommodations or visit wyomingtourism.org/placestostay.
- » Although the parks get their share of warm summer days, snow is possible as late as June, so pack accordingly.
- » Roads in Yellowstone are closed in the winter, and spring and fall road closures are common, but that doesn't mean that the parks are closed! Go to page 58 to learn about vacation ideas at these national parks during the wintertime.

3 STEPS TO A SUMMER VACATION IN YELLOWSTONE



Yellowstone National Park boasts the most and the widest array of geothermal features in the world, legendary wildlife and a hint of what the continent was like before civilization.

STEP 1: BOOK LODGING

There are nine wonderful lodging options in the park, ranging from rustic simplicity to historic opulence. If you prefer to camp, there are five campgrounds run by Xanterra Parks & Resorts that allow reservations (call 307-344-7311). Seven campgrounds, however, are run by the National Park Service on a first-come, first-served basis and often fill up by mid-morning. Most campgrounds operate from mid-June through mid-September, although Mammoth Campground is open year-round.

You can also consider staying nearby in Jackson (60 miles south) or Cody (50 miles east). Your options range from ranches and cabins to vacation rentals, historic hotels and B&Bs. Most offer daily transportation to and from Yellowstone.

It's advised to book your lodging up to eight months in advance. Go to page 149 for a directory of places to stay in and around Yellowstone.

STEP 2: PLAN HOW TO GET THERE

Although much of Yellowstone's appeal is its unspoiled seclusion, it's easily accessible for travelers.

FLY: If you're planning on flying, the Yellowstone Regional Airport is about three miles outside of Cody, near the park's east entrance, and it offers service from Salt Lake City and Denver. Jackson Hole Airport is about 50 miles south of the park and offers service from different cities depending on the season. For a full fly list visit jacksonholeairport.com. Car rentals and shuttle services to the lodges inside park, nearby towns and hotels are available at all of the airports.

DRIVE: Go to page 22 to choose a driving itinerary that leads to the park from four different Wyoming entry points.

STEP 3: CHOOSE YOUR ADVENTURE

Because Yellowstone is so large and there are so many things to see and do, it's a good idea to plan your adventures well in advance (we suggest up to three months). Whether you choose to embark on a day hike or a backcountry excursion, venturing away from the paved roads in Yellowstone is a wonderful way to experience its peaceful grandeur. Camping in the backcountry requires a permit, and campsites can be reserved.

Non-motorized transportation can also be a great way to see the park. One- and two-hour guided horseback rides are offered at Mammoth, Tower-Roosevelt and Canyon.


A FEW MORE THINGS TO KEEP IN MIND:

Driving in Yellowstone: It's hard to predict how long it will take to get around — it often depends on traffic and weather, but also on how often you want to stop and look around.

Yellowstone is Big: You won't be able to see it all in a single visit.

Weather: Temperatures in Yellowstone vary by elevation. Be prepared for anything from warm summer temperatures to snow as late as June.

Entrance Passes: Passes are good for seven days for both Yellowstone and Grand Teton national parks. Visit nps.gov/yell for fee information.



There are numerous ways to enjoy boating in the park. Bay Bridge Marina on Yellowstone Lake rents rowboats and motorboats, and scenic cruises leave from there regularly in the summer. If you have your own boat, motorized or not, you must have a permit.

World-class fly fishing in the park's rivers and streams is popular, and you can take a guided tour on a cabin cruiser or rent an outboard or rowboat. The fishing season begins the Saturday before Memorial Day weekend and lasts until early November. All anglers over the age of 15 must have a permit.

Both of us staring in wide-eyed wonder as it leaps impossibly high into the air, painting clouds in the clear blue Wyoming sky. 




OFFICIAL YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK TOPOGRAPHICAL MAP







2 RAFT AWAY

Float down the relaxing Snake River while enjoying spectacular views of dense forests and the majestic Tetons. On a guided float trip, you'll get a lesson in Wyoming's flora and fauna and have a chance to spot local wildlife such as moose, bison, bald eagles, elk and beavers. For adventurers seeking a bit of excitement, opt for a guided whitewater excursion, which will take you through canyons and rapids.

3 PLAY A ROUND

Tee off among jutting, snow-dusted mountains, lush fairways and serene lakes on the 18-hole course at Jackson Hole Golf & Tennis Club. This golf course is consistently named the best in Wyoming and has high-quality amenities like extra tee boxes, cart paths, practice facilities, a new fleet of club cars and a 12,000-square-foot LEED-certified clubhouse.

4 PEDAL A PATH

Although biking on trails is not permitted in Grand Teton National Park, cyclists are allowed to pedal on roadways. And, don't miss a ride along the paved, multi-use pathway that stretches eight miles from Moose Junction all the way to South Jenny Lake. To get in some off-road biking, head to nearby Jackson, a mountain-biking haven.



5 TACKLE THE TETONS

Experienced and novice hikers alike will love the range of scenic trails scattered throughout the park. Beginners should try a low-elevation route, such as the 1.2-mile hike to Phelps Lake, whereas advanced adventurers can opt for a challenging trek up Hanging Canyon. Hikers looking for a moderate challenge should try the trail leading to Solitude Lake. The 16-mile journey starts at South Jenny Lake and winds through wildflower-filled valleys and Cascade Canyon.



6 DROP A HOOK

With its abundance of deep blue lakes, spring streams and the Snake River, Grand Teton National Park offers plenty of options for anglers looking to snag their next big catch. Head to Colter Bay Village Marina on Jackson Lake for fishing licenses and boat rentals, or schedule a guided fly-fishing tour.



7 WATCH FOR WILDLIFE


Sixty species of mammals, more than 300 species of birds and a half-dozen game fish call the park home, so spotting critters in their natural habitats should be easy — as long as you know where to look. Bring a pair of binoculars and search for osprey, bald eagles, elk, coyotes and muskrats.



THE RODEO

A TRUE WYOMING EXPERIENCE

In Wyoming, it doesn't take long to realize why they call it the Cowboy State. Just look at the Wrangler-clad residents, the license plates and, of course, the most popular sport in the state — rodeo. Almost every town, big or small, hosts a rodeo of sorts throughout the summer where locals gather to engage in the revelry.

Maybe it's the culture that surrounds it, or maybe it's the history behind it, but rodeo is unlike any other sport. Nowhere else can you truly sop up the Wyoming way of life quite like this. With animated announcers and traditional cowboys and cowgirls, any evening at the arena will be a whirlwind of Western charm, skilled horsemanship and riotous entertainment.

Born in the days of cattle and cowboys in the Wild West, rodeo planted its seed in Western culture with groups of cowboys showing off their riding and roping talents, sometimes competing with neighboring outfits. Eventually these get-togethers moved into towns as organized "buckin' shows" and became increasingly popular.

Go to page 24 for a list of popular rodeos in the state and use these tips below before you head to the arena.

DRESS THE PART

You'll find plenty of Western stores in Wyoming that will be happy to outfit you with authentic Western wear. Make sure

to attach an oversized buckle to your big belt. In this case, the bigger the better. Just be sure to leave most of your glittery sparkle at home — here, that belongs to our beloved rodeo queens — plus the rodeo tends to get a little dirty.

LEARN THE LINGO

- » A "pickup man" isn't a guy looking for a date, but rather the horseback cowboy in the arena who "picks up" the bronc riders from their horses after a ride.
- » If someone says "dally" they aren't telling you to lollygag around and take your time. Instead, "dally" refers to the action of wrapping the end of the rope around the saddle horn immediately after an animal is roped.
- » A "spinner" is a bull that circles around, spinning and whipping the rider in a flurry. More points are awarded for successful rides on "spinners" that go both left and right.

GET WITH THE PROGRAM

A typical rodeo consists of seven main events. These include bareback riding, tie down roping, team roping, bull riding, steer wrestling, saddle bronc riding and barrel racing.

THE BASIC COWBOY LOOK

Get a pair of boots.

Slip on a pair of jeans.

Don a hat.

EXTRA CREDIT

Wear a Western shirt with style.

Get a good belt and an even better buckle.







ONCE UPON A TIME

RELIVE THE STORIES OF THE OLD WEST

William F. “Buffalo Bill” Cody, Sacajawea, Kit Carson, Butch Cassidy ... such characters’ names precede them — but do you really know the people and events that shaped the American West? From Indian Wars to the world’s first official women’s suffrage, the spirit of the past will sweep you up and remind you just what makes the Old West endlessly fascinating.

WHERE TO START? LISTEN TO WHAT CALLS TO YOU ...



OLD WEST ATTRACTIONS & MUSEUMS

Western-themed attractions and museums dot Wyoming like bullet holes through a covered wagon. Cody, near Yellowstone National Park, is an excellent starting point, with plenty of ways to explore town founder Buffalo Bill’s legendary personality and the Old West he loved. Here, the Buffalo Bill Center of the West houses the Buffalo Bill Museum, Plains Indian Museum, Cody Firearms Museum, Draper Natural History Museum and the Whitney Western Art Museum. Another popular hub for Old West exploration is Fort Laramie, once an important fur-trading post. At the Fort Laramie Historic Site find restored historic buildings and museum exhibits displaying uniforms, weapons and other artifacts.

NATIVE AMERICAN HISTORY

Evidence of prehistoric inhabitants in Wyoming dates back 12,000 years and provides endlessly rich explorations of Native American culture. East of Lovell is the Medicine Wheel, a mysterious, ancient stone shrine. In Northwest Wyoming, Fort Washakie is home to the Wind River Reservation, the nation’s seventh largest. Here you can visit the graves of Chief Washakie and Sacajawea, the Shoshone woman who helped guide the Lewis and Clark expedition. Also view petroglyphs along the Green River; visit Crowheart Butte, site of a famous 1866 battle; and museums throughout the state, such as the Arapaho Cultural Museum in Ethete and Shoshone Tribal Cultural Center in Fort Washakie.

FRONTIER TRAILS

Gold seekers and other pioneers made their way through Wyoming in the 1800s on frontier trails that crisscrossed Wyoming. In Casper, home to the National Historic Trails Interpretive Center, you can delve into the history of the Oregon Trail, the Mormon Trail, the California Trail and the Pony Express route through living-history presentations, tours and events. Also check out the still-visible “signature ruts” of the Oregon Trail near Guernsey. For an exciting family experience, relive the adventure of the American West on a covered wagon train ride.

RODEOS

Bucking broncos, raging bulls and the cowboys who dare to ride them draw big crowds in most Wyoming towns. Lander claims the oldest paid rodeo in the world, the Lander Pioneer Days Rodeo. The Annual Cody Stampede is an Independence Day favorite, and the town also hosts the Cody Nite Rodeo every evening all summer long. Then, there’s the “Daddy of ‘Em All,” the Cheyenne Frontier Days Rodeo, a 10-day event featuring some of the industry’s top competitors.



GUIDED ADVENTURES & OUTFITTERS

If you've always dreamed of a Forever West vacation, but you're intimidated about wandering into the wilds of Wyoming on your own, consider hiring an outfitter to make your dreams come true. Outfitters will organize your trip from arrival to departure, ensuring you'll have a full belly during the day and a place to lay your head at night.

If getting proper gear is your Achilles' heel, outfitters can help with that too. Perhaps you need to rent a Jeep, horse, tent or llama to help with your upcoming backcountry trip, or maybe you just need someone to help you plan that epic climb on the north face of Devils Tower that you've been dreaming of for so long. Think of outfitters as a la carte; they'll help with equipment needs to create a 100 percent worry-free trip.



WYOMING ON HORSEBACK

Horseback riding in Wyoming gives the unique opportunity to inhale some much-needed fresh air and venture across acres and acres of wilderness not accessible by foot or car. There's really no better way to roam free than to saddle up and wander through wide-open spaces, over jagged peaks and across rushing streams that criss-cross the landscape.

The best advice: Call a riding outfitter and explain your interests, time frame and experience. Approachable outfitters are more than willing to customize a horseback-riding experience that fits your personal needs and wants.

CHOOSE FROM THESE POPULAR HORSEBACK-RIDING ADVENTURES:

DAY TRIPS:

Perfect for families, day trips are a good way to stretch your legs while road tripping through the state. They also provide a great opportunity to see Wyoming's top attractions in a new light. Trot the grounds in Yellowstone, Grand Teton National Park, Jackson Hole, Bighorn Mountains or the Bridger Wilderness Area.

SUMMER PACK TRIPS:

Multi-day guided pack trips let riders delve deep into Wyoming's wilderness and get chummy with their horse companion. Cooks accompany the trip and whip up authentic chuckwagon meals and genuine cowboy breakfasts to counter the massive amounts of calories you'll burn in and out of the saddle on your adventurous expedition.

FISHING TRIPS:






HIT THE OPEN ROAD IN AN RV

Wyoming's open roads, state and national parks, plentiful campgrounds and RV-friendly towns beckon those who love to travel in the comfort of a recreational vehicle. Remember, many of Wyoming's attractions and charming towns lie slightly off the beaten path, so don't be shy to detour off the interstates and explore our hidden treasures and incredible landscapes.




NORTHEAST WYOMING

Visit the state-of-the-art welcome center near the state border on I-90, which features interactive displays and friendly folks who can give you all the information you need for your RV adventure. The highway then rolls over the western edge of the Black Hills, passes near Sundance Mountain and traverses the northern edge of the Powder River Basin before flanking the eastern side of the Bighorn Mountains. Be sure to take some side trips to explore some of Northeast Wyoming's true gems, as well as many of its picturesque campgrounds. Those of particular appeal include Devils Tower KOA, just outside the boundaries of the nation's first national monument, west of Hulett. Buffalo and Sheridan have multiple RV parks as well as numerous Native American war sites and museums — don't miss the art at the Bradford Brinton Memorial west of Sheridan.



CENTRAL WYOMING

Continuing into the heart of the state, you'll find Casper, where several campgrounds/RV parks offer full services and local museums enthrall. Try the Tate Geological Museum, where you will see the largest mounted Columbian Mammoth in the world, or the Fort Caspar Museum, where you will learn about the local American West history. If you are a nature lover, check out Casper Mountain to hike, bike or cross-country ski on miles of scenic trails. From Casper, take I-25 south and merge onto US-26 to Guernsey where you will find several RV parks. On the way, be sure to detour three miles off the highway to Ayers Natural Bridge, a beautiful, natural rock formation with historical ties to Native Americans and white settlers.



SOUTHEAST WYOMING


Begin at the welcome center near the state border on I-25 in Cheyenne. Helpful specialists can assist you in planning the next step in your RV trip and you'll have access to a dump station and fresh water to get you ready for the next leg. Be sure to spend some time in Cheyenne, the state capital that is famous for hosting the largest outdoor rodeo in the world, Cheyenne Frontier Days. As you plan your travels beyond Cheyenne, consider don't-miss spots such as Laramie, the Snowy Range and — of special interest to anglers — the Miracle Mile of the North Platte River.



SOUTHWEST WYOMING

Interstate 80 stretches across the southern portion of the state, beginning near the western border in Evanston and continuing through Green River and Rock

Springs. The route parallels the Union Pacific Railroad, which gave birth to several communities and ultimately the Wyoming Territory as it pushed west in the late 1860s; you will find railroad history all along the highway. And don't miss one of the jewels of Wyoming: Flaming Gorge National Recreation Area.



NORTHWEST WYOMING

The Northwest region of Wyoming is home to some of America's greatest natural treasures such as Old Faithful, Grand Prismatic Spring and the craggy Teton mountains. Wake up to knockout views and sleep among our abundant wildlife in one of Wyoming's national parks. Moreover, outside of Yellowstone and Grand Teton, RV parks dot the Northwest in places near Jackson, Lander, Pinedale and Dubois.



WHAT'S YOUR WYOMING CAMPING PERSONALITY ?

In Wyoming, where the nighttime sky is filled with more bright, twinkling stars than you ever imagined possible, camping is a cherished ritual, a wonderful adventure and one of the best ways to immerse yourself in nature. With so much stunning wilderness in Wyoming, you'll find every region of the state boasts a healthy inventory of campgrounds and RV parks — which means you can choose one with the amenities and access that are just right for you, whether you're looking for a classic Western experience or a lakeside retreat.



HISTORY BUFFS will be within walking distance of authentic Western relics at Indian Campground in Northeast Wyoming.

There, grassy creekside campsites and cabin rentals are a short walk from the town of Buffalo, which has a quaint main street with shopping, an old-fashioned soda fountain, a restored 1925 carousel and Ferris wheel, a golf course and rodeos.



BOATERS can get out on the water at Glendo Lakeside RV Park in Central Wyoming. Just five minutes from Glendo State

Park's Bennett Hill boat ramp, the park has easy access to boating, fishing and water skiing. All sites are large enough to accommodate RVs and boats, and boat

rentals are available if you don't have your own vessel.



AVID CLIMBERS will have prime access to the Tetons at the American Alpine Club Climbers' Ranch in Northwest Wyoming. With dormitory-style cabins designed for adventurous climbers and their families, the ranch helps you prepare for your climb with logistics information and even a climbing library and lounge.



YELLOWSTONE VISITORS can rest after a long day of exploring the nation's first national park at Bridge Bay Campground. Located next to Bridge Bay Marina, the campground has views of Yellowstone Lake and access to water recreation. You might see bison and other wildlife nearby, and with more than 400 sites, this campground allows you to choose a shady, secluded spot or set up camp near the shore and watch the moonlight on the lake.



LEGEND LOVERS will get a dose of lore at Devils Tower KOA in Northeast Wyoming. Camping where "Close Encounters of the Third Kind" was filmed in 1977, you'll be hanging out in movie history while enjoying nightly showings of Spielberg's extraterrestrial classic. The national

monument is also a sacred American Indian site, and you can find the stories behind its cultural significance at the visitor center. The campground offers tent rental, a heated pool, free Wi-Fi, evening hayrides, horseback riding and an on-site café.



COWBOY WANNABES can put that cowboy hat and boots to good use with an overnight Western camping trip arranged by Bedroll & Breakfast in Northwest Wyoming. You'll take a sunset horseback wilderness tour, feast on a cookout-style dinner and then relax on beds inside lantern-lit tents. Wake up to breakfast and an optional half- or full-day horseback ride in the morning. It's an experience meant to indulge the inner cowboy or cowgirl in all of us.



SCENERY SEEKERS won't be disappointed at Stateline Cove Campground in Southwest Wyoming. Pitch your tent on the sandy shores of Flaming Gorge Reservoir, where stunning red-rock cliffs rise high above the shimmering blue water. Drive to the Red Canyon Overlook at sunrise for an out-of-this-world photo op.



FAMILIES love Terry Bison Ranch in Southeast Wyoming. This working ranch offers bison-viewing tours, train rides, an Old Time Photo Studio, summertime carnival rides, fishing and horseback rides. Convenience is key here, with RV pull-through sites, tent sites and cabins. You'll also find many other family-friendly activities in nearby Cheyenne.



HORSEBACK RIDERS won't find an equine-friendlier place to rest than Sundance Campground and Trailhead in Northeast Wyoming, which is designed to accommodate horses with six open corrals and two eight-horse stalls. You and your horse will be close to the trailhead for the Sundance Trail System, which offers horseback riding, hiking and biking as well as snowshoeing in the winter.



HIGH-ALTITUDE ADVENTURERS can rest their heads at 10,800 feet above sea level at Sugarloaf Campground in Southeast Wyoming, where the state's highest campground offers unobstructed views of the Snowy Range. It's only open mid-July through mid-September, and it fills up almost every one of those nights, so book early. You'll have easy access to Libby Lake and Lewis Lake for fishing, but don't be shocked if you wake up to snow in July or August.

PLACES TO SPOT WYOMING WILDLIFE



1 YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK

Needing no introduction, Yellowstone National Park is a wildlife enthusiast's paradise. You're likely to spot plenty of bison and elk from the road, but venturing into the backcountry might earn you sightings of grizzly bears, black bears, moose, gray wolves, bighorn sheep, coyotes, pronghorn, bald eagles and plenty of other wild creatures.

2 GRAND TETON NATIONAL PARK

The park's diverse landscape provides habitats for black bears, grizzly bears, moose, elk, coyotes, bison, mule deer, river otters, bald eagles, golden eagles, sage grouse, trumpeter swans and much more. For a guaranteed wintertime elk sighting, visit the National Elk Refuge, just south of the park, where 7,500 migrating elk spend each winter.

3 SEEDSKADEE NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE

North of the town of Green River, Seedskadee National Wildlife Refuge borders 36 miles along the Green River. The river provides a lush oasis for 220 species of birds and other wildlife. Drive, hike or kayak through the refuge for the chance to spot bald eagles, trumpeter swans, moose, mule deer, white-tailed jackrabbits, coyotes, foxes and more.

4 BIGHORN MOUNTAINS

Two scenic byways offer spectacular views and access to the wildlife-rich Bighorns. The 47-mile Cloud Peak Skyway Scenic Byway connects the towns of Worland and Buffalo and passes through Ten Sleep; while the 58-mile Bighorn Scenic Byway winds from Shell east toward Sheridan. Keep an eye out for elk, mule deer, white-tail deer, coyotes, black bears, mountain lions, wild turkeys, sage grouse and bald and golden eagles.



5 MEDICINE BOW NATIONAL FOREST

Moose, elk, mule deer, beaver, black bear, bobcat and coyote are just a few of the species in Medicine Bow National Forest. Travel through high mountain passes and past stunning lakes while looking for wildlife along the Snowy Range Scenic Byway, which composes a section of Hwy 130 between Laramie and Saratoga in the Southeast region.

6 PILOT BUTTE WILD HORSE SCENIC LOOP

Connecting Green River and Rock Springs in the Southwest region, the 24-mile Pilot Butte Wild Horse Scenic Loop is one of the best places in the country to experience the thrill of watching a galloping herd of wild horses. The gravel road takes you through an area in which an estimated 1,500 horses roam.

7 THE RED DESERT

Arid deserts aren't often known as prime habitat for wild animals, but southwestern Wyoming's Red Desert is the exception. Its 6 million acres of sand dunes and buttes are home to 350 species of wildlife, including the largest migratory herd of pronghorn in the contiguous U.S. and the world's largest herd of rare desert elk.

8 WIND RIVER MOUNTAINS

The Wind River Range comprises a landscape of high peaks (35 of which reach more than 13,000 feet in elevation), lush valleys, more than 1,300 lakes and the wild Wind River, making it a postcard-worthy setting for backcountry wildlife watching. Hike one of the plentiful trails and look for moose, elk, black bears, grizzly bears, wolves and mountain lions.

1 DOGSLEDDING: Mush your way across the pristine white landscape with eight of your newest canine companions. The Teton and Shoshone national forests in Northwest Wyoming are rich with trails and guide companies.

2 SLEIGH RIDES: Gliding through the snow in a horse-drawn sleigh will forever be a fond family memory. You can personalize your experience with plenty of package options, such as a trip to and from an elegant dinner or a cozy campfire in the Wyoming wilderness.

3 SNOWSHOEING: While this serene winter sport might seem intimidating to newbies, no training is necessary. 

LOCALS' FAVORITE PLACES TO SKI & RIDE

It's no secret that Jackson Hole Mountain Resort offers some of the best skiing and riding in the nation. However, you may not know that Wyoming is also home to several other epic skiing and riding areas that boast some of the largest average annual snowfall, providing deep, fluffy and abundant snow conditions.

SNOWY RANGE SKI RESORT

Located 32 miles west of Laramie, Snowy Range Ski Resort is in the heart of the magnificent Medicine Bow-Routt National Forest. Riders will relish the Renegade Park and half-pipe while skiers can rip turns down the long trails.



WHITE PINE SKI RESORT

Just 10 miles from Pinedale in the stunning Wind River Mountains, White Pine Ski Resort is Wyoming's oldest ski area and a dedicated family-oriented mountain. Eleven hundred feet of vertical terrain give way to 350 acres of skiable terrain with 22+ named runs and few, if any, lift lines.

SLEEPING GIANT SKI AREA

Snowmobiling Wyoming's vast wilderness and varied terrain is easily one of the most thrilling ways to experience the state. You'll glide past an abundance of wildlife, see the most breathtaking views and quench your desire for an adventure of a lifetime.



Wyoming's long winter season extends from mid-December through the beginning of April, making it easy to plan more than one adventure per season — and we all know one snowmobiling session is never quite enough. With more than 2,000 miles of snowmobile trails in Wyoming, there's an abundance of epic snowmobiling adventure (and snow!) waiting for you to explore.

Rev your motor and get ready to plow through some wicked inclines and experience the adrenaline-charged ride of a lifetime.

SNOWIES & SIERRA MADRES

Wyoming is a renowned powder stash and lives up to its reputation as a snowmobile haven each winter with annual snowfall of 25 feet of fresh powder in their open bowls. Located just along the state border of Colorado, this destination's forested woods and hundreds of miles of ungroomed trails make for a great weekend trip.

YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK

If you're looking for a quintessential snowmobiling experience, this is it. You'll have the privilege of touring the park in rare form: covered in snow and with much fewer visitors than in the summer. See all the pristine sights (geysers, falls, wildlife, etc.) along the trails with the help of an authorized commercial guide.

CONTINENTAL DIVIDE

The Continental Divide is perfect for experienced snowmobilers looking to trailblaze on their own into challenging terrain — not to mention it's consistently ranked among the best snowmobiling destinations in the country. This trail system is the longest in the West, boasting a 270-mile route that begins in Lander and ends in Grand Teton National Park.

WYOMING RANGE

Another coveted winter playground complete with deep blankets of snow. Get lost in hundreds of miles of both groomed and ungroomed trails reaching close to 10,000 feet in elevation (aka: amazing views!). Trailheads can be accessed from Pinedale, Big Piney and LaBarge, all of which have cozy cabins and other lodging options for you to rest your sledhead.


NORTH/NORTHEAST WYOMING

This section of the state offers equally enticing terrain with a fair share of powder and exhilarating trails. The Bighorn Mountains have a convenient trail system divided into north and south sections, so multiple-day trips can easily be planned to cover all of their 342 miles of groomed trails or 49 miles of ungroomed trails.

BLACK HILLS & CASPER MOUNTAIN

Pine-blanketed mountains and 55 miles (plus the 295 of groomed trails that extend into the South Dakota Black Hills) of deep groomed trails make the Black Hills a must-ride. The centrally located Casper Mountain trail system offers stunning trails with easy-to-follow directions and international signage. Tour the area on their 46 miles of groomed trails and snow depths ranging up to three feet.

A WINTER GUIDE TO WYOMING'S NATIONAL PARKS & MONUMENTS

Sure, the neighbors' fridge is plastered with vacation pics of the Tetons blanketed in wildflowers, but have they ever seen steam ethereally rising off the back of a bison against a snowy field in Yellowstone? Few people know about the true charms of a winter getaway to Wyoming's national parks and monuments — but that's part of the glory. You're more likely to have these majestic spots to yourself.

YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK

THE SCENE: Otherworldly forests draped in white, steaming hot springs and geysers, and a sense of quietude make the park quite magical in winter, a season when only about three percent of its annual visitors venture to the park.

THE ACTIVITIES: It's safe to say that the biggest draw in winter is wildlife watching. Animals are much easier to spot against the snowy landscape, and in places such as Lamar Valley, called the "Little Serengeti of America," you'll have ample opportunity to see wolves, moose, bison, antelope, deer, coyotes and birds. Organized wildlife-watching tours make it possible to traverse the frozen landscape safely. Additionally, miles of terrain are open for snowshoeing and cross-country skiing. Dog sledding tours are another thrilling way to see the park, as is snowmobil-

ing, though a bit of planning is required since it is strictly regulated by the park.

CONSIDERATIONS: Cars are not allowed in the park mid-November to mid-April, except on a limited stretch of road to Mammoth Hot Springs through the North Entrance. Visitors can enter the park through other entrances via scheduled snow coaches or on foot, snowshoes or skis. There are several authorized snowmobile and snow-coach guides near Yellowstone.

GRAND TETON NATIONAL PARK

THE SCENE: The park's jagged, granite mountains are even more dramatic when dusted in brilliant white snow; and at sunrise and sunset, the white peaks reflect a stunning range of colors. Plus, caches of deep snowy powder and

frozen lakes make this area a winter recreation dream come true.

THE ACTIVITIES: A ranger-led snowshoeing trek can be a fun way for families to learn more about the park's ecology, or you can venture up snowy trails on your own on snowshoes or cross-country skis to experience the peaceful, snow-muffled hush that falls across the Tetons in winter. Approved snowmobiles are allowed on Grassy Lake Road and Jackson Lake, the latter of which offers excellent ice fishing.

CONSIDERATIONS: The park's main roadways, Hwy U.S. 89/191 and Hwy U.S. 26/287, are plowed and open for winter travel from Jackson to Flagg Ranch just south of Yellowstone National Park. Teton Park Road (Taggart Trailhead to Signal Mountain Lodge) is closed to vehicles but open to skiing and snowshoeing access. Be sure to be prepared with snow tires and an emergency kit when traveling the park in wintertime.

DEVILS TOWER NATIONAL MONUMENT

THE SCENE: Hundreds of parallel cracks create large hexagonal columns that give Devils Tower its unique geological appearance — and the textures are especially interesting when given a light dusting of snow.

THE ACTIVITIES: Photographers come to the tower year-round to capture the mysterious formation, which becomes even more intriguing



WINTER REFUGES WITHIN THE PARKS

In Yellowstone, two rather modest-but-cozy accommodations are available in winter: **Old Faithful Snow Lodge & Cabins** is accessible only by snow coach, and the **Mammoth Hot Springs Hotel & Cabins** offers the only winter accommodations in the park that are accessible by car. Both hotels offer equipment rentals, guides and tours.

In Grand Teton National Park, the lodgepole-furniture-decorated **Dornans Spur Ranch Cabins** are located on the beautiful Snake River. **Triangle X Ranch** is the other option, a working dude ranch where you can relax next to a warm fire or in a large outdoor Jacuzzi.

Because winter options are limited, they also fill up fast, so make reservations as early as possible.

amid a ghostly winter landscape — so bring your camera. Devils Tower is also a favorite rock-climbing destination, and sometimes mild winter conditions make for great, unspoiled climbing opportunities. Hikers, snowshoers and cross-country skiers will enjoy the serene trails near the monument.

CONSIDERATIONS: The road to the picnic area and "Circle of Sacred Smoke" sculpture may not be open in the winter.



NORTHWEST

STATE PARKS

- » **Boysen State Park:** Centered around the location where the Wind River Canyon pours into Boysen Reservoir, visitors enjoy boating, fishing and swimming in addition to scenically located campsites.
- » **Sinks Canyon State Park:** The word “sink” in this park’s name comes from the Popo Agie River vanishing from the state park land into a cavern and reappearing as a pond filled to the brim with trout.
- » **Hot Springs State Park:** Stand-out features include a 104-degree bathhouse for visitors looking for a soothing soak and a suspension bridge overlooking the Bighorn River. If you’re visiting in the fall or winter months, check out the bison-herd feeding at 8:30 a.m. daily.
- » **Buffalo Bill State Park:** Located near Cody, the park is encircled by stunning views of the Absaroka Mountains. In addition to camping and trout fishing, you’ll find adventurous wind surfers testing out the calm waters on the reservoir.
- » **Medicine Lodge State Archaeological Site:** Known for its rare collection of American Indian petroglyphs and pictographs on a sizable sandstone cliff, it’s also a great place to camp, horseback ride and watch wildlife on the outskirts of the Bighorn Mountains. Visit the information center for more information about the 10,000-year-old treasures.

With two iconic national parks, scenery straight out of an adventure magazine and plenty of welcoming towns, the Northwest region offers vacation options ranging from rugged backcountry escapes to serene, luxurious retreats. You’ve probably heard about some of the famous sites here — the soothing hot springs of Thermopolis, the quintessential Western streets of Cody and the charming town of Jackson and its famous ski resorts — but Northwest Wyoming is packed with so many other treasures. NORTHWEST REGION OVERVIEW

1 JACKSON & TETON VILLAGE

Surrounded by scenic Jackson Hole and the majestic Tetons, this little metropolis lets you experience genuine cowboy culture on guest ranches, at rodeos and, of course, over drinks at the Million Dollar Cowboy Bar. In nearby Teton Village (at the base of Jackson Hole Mountain Resort), you'll find even more to explore while you soak up the incredible beauty of the area.

2 DUBOIS

A small Western town embraced by the Absaroka and Wind River mountains, Dubois offers trout-filled streams, dude ranches, rodeos and hiking trails. Somewhere comfortably between sleepy and bustling, its historic downtown has several bars that often have live music. Don't miss the National Bighorn Sheep Interpretive Center.

6 CODY

Teeming with Wild West history and lore, Cody provides the perfect setting to get into the Forever West spirit. The town hosts renowned summertime events such as rodeos, shootouts, parades and powwows. A popular tourist spot and a gateway to Yellowstone National Park, Cody is named for Buffalo Bill Cody and is home to the Buffalo Bill Center of the West.

3 LANDER & RIVERTON

At the heart of the Wind River Basin, these two towns attract those looking to set up camp along the Popo Agie (pronounced pu-PO-juh) River. Visitors will find first-rate rock climbing, traditional American Indian culture and untouched wilderness areas. Sinks Canyon State Park, six miles southwest of Lander, contains a geological oddity involving a disappearing river.

4 THERMOPOLIS

Thermopolis is a wonderful place for both recreation and relaxation. Nearby rivers and canyons offer picturesque whitewater rafting and trout fishing, and archaeological digs are constantly turning up dinosaur bones in the red-hued mountains. At Hot Springs State Park — home to the largest mineral springs in the world — you'll find picturesque boardwalks, calming hot-spring pools and several fun water parks.

5 WORLAND, GREYBULL, LOVELL & POWELL

Looking for pioneer history, friendly locals and outdoor adventures? You'll find all that and more in these low-key towns set amid the desert badlands backdrop of the Bighorn Basin. With 1,000-plus miles of hiking and horseback trails, golf courses and the Bighorn, Greybull and Shoshone rivers nearby, these towns make prime base camps for recreation. In summer, there's almost always a festival or rodeo to enjoy.





HEAVENLY HOT SPRINGS



For centuries, the hot springs of Wyoming have been revered attractions. Native Americans, even if they were from warring tribes, used to settle down shoulder-to-shoulder into hot springs along the banks of the North Platte River, where they believed the water had healing powers. Settlers traveling westward on the Oregon Trail also stopped along the way to soak their weary feet. Modern visitors still flock to the naturally heated pools and springs to relax and have some fun. Check out these popular soaking spots in Northwest Wyoming.

HOT SPRINGS STATE PARK

In Thermopolis, Hot Springs State Park is the most visited park in the Wyoming State Park system. Families love the herd of buffalo wandering the park grounds and the Star Plunge pool with its waterslides, and couples migrate to the State Bathhouse. While the State Bathhouse has an indoor and outdoor soaking pool (both of which require bathers to wear swimsuits), it also has clothing-optional private tubs where, not only do you get the place to yourself, but you're also able to pick the water temperature you want. The park is open year-round and is especially lovely in the winter.

GRANITE HOT SPRINGS

If you're looking for a wilderness feel, head just south of Grand Teton and Yellowstone national parks. Granite's waterfall-fed, 104-degree, seven-foot-deep pool is tucked into the base of a cliff. Anyone can get to Granite between spring and fall by driving the 12-mile-long dirt road, but only those willing to snowmobile, ski, snowshoe or dog sled in from the highway can soak here come winter. From June through September, there is a campground open just a mile from the pool.

BEYOND YELLOWSTONE

10 GREAT HIKES IN NORTHWEST WYOMING

The abundance of great hiking trails in Yellowstone is a given, so we decided to look beyond the nation's first national park for these 10 amazing trails in Northwest Wyoming. Listed from easiest to toughest, these hikes range from a super-easy nature stroll to a strenuous overnight adventure.

1 POPO AGIE NATURE TRAIL: JUST A WALK IN THE PARK

Six miles outside of Lander at Sinks Canyon State Park, the Popo Agie River rushes through a canyon and then abruptly disappears into a cavern. Check out this phenomenon known as the "sinks" at the visitor center, then walk a quarter-mile trail to the "rise," where the river reappears after flowing underground.

2 GOOSEBERRY BADLANDS SCENIC OVERLOOK TRAIL: A DESERT STROLL

Otherworldly rock formations rise from the desert soil (which changes color with the seasons) in every direction along this 1.5-mile interpretive trail 25 miles west of Worland. A scenic overlook provides a panoramic view of the colorful geologic oddities.

3 JADE LAKES: VERDANT ADVENTURE

The Jade Lakes Trail outside of Dubois is an easy four-mile round-trip hike to a pair of emerald-green lakes. After a half-mile trek up a steep hill, the trail evens out through gorgeous forestland until you reach Upper Jade Lake and the stratified volcanic cliffs towering over its shores. From there, Lower Jade Lake is another half-mile walk along slightly steeper terrain.

4 HERMITAGE POINT TRAIL: A LONG & WINDING ROAD

This 8.8-mile loop in Grand Teton National Park follows

a quiet peninsula on Jackson Lake through thick forest, rolling hills and sagebrush meadows, affording spectacular views of the lake and Mt. Moran. The flat terrain is not terribly taxing, and the loop can be completed in about four hours.

5 PAINT ROCK CANYON TRAIL: TEEMING WITH WILDLIFE


About five miles from Hyattville, this trail offers great views of near-vertical limestone canyon walls and beautiful open meadows as it follows the Paint Rock Creek five miles up the canyon. Conifers, mountain mahogany and sagebrush surround the area, which is home to elk, mule deer, songbirds and raptors, and the creek itself is known as an excellent trout stream.

6 BEAUTY LAKE TRAIL: HARD-EARNED VIEWS

This five-mile out-and-back trail outside of Powell in the Shoshone National Forest delivers impressive views from the start. Beginning at Beartooth Lake, which is flanked by the Beartooth Butte, this short but difficult trail leads you first to the pristine Beauty Lake and then to Crane Lake and surrounding alpine meadows.

7 MEADOW CREEK TRAIL: SERENE SOLITUDE

The views of Dundee Mountain, paired with almost guaranteed solitude, are worth the challenging drive to access this six-mile trail. Just outside



of Meeteetse in the Absaroka Range, this moderately challenging hike leads you across a number of switchbacks and through a massive old rockslide to an unspoiled alpine basin at the base of Chief Mountain.

8 HEART MOUNTAIN TRAIL: HEART-PUMPING HIKE

This strenuous but rewarding trail just outside of Cody is about seven miles round trip. You won't come close to clocking as much mileage as the mountain once did. During a period of turbulent geologic activity about 50 million years ago, what is now the top of Heart Mountain broke away from its range and sped 62 miles across Wyoming in less than 30 minutes. Today, the peak rests atop a base that is 250 million years its junior. Heart Mountain offers heart-pumping inclines that will earn you panoramic views of the Absaroka Mountains.

9 LOST TWIN LAKES TRAIL: WILDERNESS RETREAT

Not far from Ten Sleep in the Cloud Peak Wilderness of Bighorn National Park, the moderately strenuous Lost Twin Lakes trail climbs 1,200 feet in just more than 10 miles. Winding through meadows and forests of lodgepole pine, the trail culminates with an impressive view of the massive vertical cliffs that rise from the far side of the lakes.

10 BUCKING MULE FALLS NATIONAL RECREATION TRAIL: WORTH A NIGHT IN A TENT

If you're up for a two-day hike, this trail near Lovell in the Bighorn National Forest takes you through 11 miles of thick forests, wildflower-strewn meadows and some fairly steep terrain to the highly photogenic, 600-foot Bucking Mule Falls. The trail is one way, so it's an 11-mile hike back out.

>> **Keyhole State Park:** Located on the cusp of the Black Hills, Keyhole has activities to keep you busy all year long, including snowmobiling, bird watching (the park is home to 255 species), boating and hiking.

With no traffic, fewer people and wide-open skies, Northeast Wyoming will redefine your concept of fresh air. Dotted the spectacular landscape, you'll find charming towns where 19th-century hotels, shops and restaurants still welcome travelers and outdoor recreation abounds. Acres of public land, sagebrush plains and rolling hills set the scene for trips ranging from family outings to solitary adventures. Towns such as Sheridan, Newcastle and Buffalo are brimming with Western history and charm. The Northeast is also rich in unspoiled natural wonders — Devils Tower and Black Hills National Forest are just the beginning. Begin your discovery at wyomingtourism.org.

NORTHEAST REGION OVERVIEW

1 SHERIDAN

This outpost in the middle of a rugged and secluded valley is the perfect mix of Old West style and modern ambiance. Beautiful homes line the streets, ranging in architectural style from Victorian to Flemish revival. Four golf courses are close to the city, and in wildflower season — June and July — flowers bloom in profusion in the nearby Cloud Peak Wilderness.

2 BUFFALO

Immerse yourself in the Old West in Buffalo, 35 miles south of Sheridan. Buffalo's Main Street is a menagerie of historic buildings and frontier charm. Stop by for a milkshake from an old-time soda fountain and then head for the hills — the Big-horn Mountains are literally Buffalo's sprawling backyard. The Big Horn


Mountain Festival in July brings a host of down-home bluegrass performers to the city.

3 GILLETTE/WRIGHT

In the center of the region, Gillette is a great launching pad for exploring the Northeast. In town, take a coal-mine tour or visit the Rockpile Museum, featuring antique rifles and spurs, Native American artifacts and vintage farming and ranching items. The Cam-Plex Multi-Event Facilities has a calendar packed with rodeo events and concerts, which often include big-name country acts. In nearby Wright, the Wright Museum profiles the area's pioneers, homesteads and coal mines. Free coal-mine tours are offered June through August.

4 NEWCASTLE

After miles and miles of driving through open plains, visitors to Newcastle are greeted with the dark green forests of the Black Hills that encroach to the northeast. Stop for a bite to eat in one of the town's old-fashioned diners or head to the hills to stretch your legs and play. The Black Hills National Forest offers ample opportunities for fishing, hunting, camping, hiking and mountain biking.



5 SUNDANCE/PINE HAVEN/DEVILS TOWER

Biking in the Black Hills and fishing on Cook Lake, picnicking by the Belle Fourche River are just two of the fresh-air-filled activities that the Sundance area offers. The tranquil town of Pine Haven is right next to Keyhole State Park and Reservoir, a great place for fishing, boating and winter snowmobiling. And, of course, the iconic Devils Tower National Monument is a world-famous tourist attraction.



DEVILS TOWER NATIONAL MONUMENT

Devils Tower National Monument, which looms more than 1,200 feet above Wyoming's eastern plains and the Belle Fourche River, is a one-of-a-kind natural wonder. The flat-topped volcanic formation is found amid some of the state's most beautiful country, leaving you plenty to do after you behold its otherworldly presence.

HIKE

Hike along eight miles of nature trails near the monument. The most popular trail is the 1.3-mile paved circuit around the massive rock formation, while others wind in and around the surrounding forest and meadowlands. April, May and June are popular with wildflower-lovers — nearly 60 varieties of wildflowers have been spotted in the area.

TOUR

Take a ranger-led tour of the monument. The easy 1.5-hour walk features topics that include geology, the area's indigenous people, wildlife and more. Be sure to bring comfortable shoes and a water bottle.

LEARN

Visit during the summer for the National Park Service's Summer Cultural Program to hear speakers on a variety of subjects. On select evenings, there's also a Full Moon Walk that begins at dusk for hikers with flashlights.

CLIMB

The tower's sheer rock faces and hundreds of columns and cracks are a siren song for climbers. All climbers must register with park authorities and check in after their climb. The tower closes to climbers during the month of June for a voluntary climbing ban out of respect for American Indian traditional cultural activities. Local guides can help you with any equipment and instruction you require.

FISH


Look for black bullhead, channel catfish and the area's famed walleye in the Belle Fourche. Be sure to check with the Wyoming Game and Fish Department for information on licensing and regulations at wgfd.wyo.gov.

BOAT

Go boating on nearby Keyhole Reservoir's 14,000 wide-open acres and explore a few of its coves. Or, relax on its 50-plus miles of beautiful shoreline in Keyhole State Park. The marina can set you up with snacks, bait and tackle, fishing licenses and a public boat ramp.

SLEEP

The popular 50-site Belle Fourche Campground is within the park itself (closed in winter), and several other campsites near the entrance offer superb views of the tower. There's also the town of Hulett, where you'll find several motels and restaurants just nine miles from the park.



CHECK OUT THE DEVILS TOWER VISITOR CENTER

Learn more about the tower's geology as well as the culture and history of the area through historical photos and other displays before you set out to explore. Open year-round.

HIDDEN GEMS IN NORTHEAST WYOMING

Visitors flock to the wide-open spaces of Northeast Wyoming to visit Devils Tower and play in the Black Hills, but savvy travelers won't want to miss the area's many charming small towns and the hidden gems they hold.

1 FORT PHIL KEARNY STATE HISTORIC SITE: Built in 1866 to protect emigrants traveling along the Bozeman Trail, the site now features living history demonstrations, an interpretive center and self-guided walking tours on Fort Phil Kearny, Fort Fetterman and Wagon Box Battlefield sites.

2 WYO THEATER: Opened in 1923, the WYO was one of the first and is now the oldest operating vaudeville theater in Wyoming. The WYO now brings professional music, dance and theater to historic Sheridan and makes for a perfect night out when you're in town.

3 HOOFPRIENTS OF THE PAST MUSEUM: Exhibits at this museum in downtown Kaycee cover the history of Johnson County with special attention to the Hole-in-the-Wall, Johnson County Invasion, Dull Knife Battlefield, Fort Reno and the Bozeman Trail.

4 PONDEROSA CAFÉ & BAR: This charming local restaurant offers outstanding gourmet meals at hometown prices in Hulett. A wide variety of choices include the dining room's fresh, seasonal menus and familiar favorites in the bar.

5 COOK LAKE RECREATION AREA: A perfect place to relax with your family, this park boasts fishing, hiking, camping, hunting, canoeing and biking. It makes a stunning backdrop for unforgettable memories.

6 SHERIDAN'S MAIN STREET: With a picturesque mountain backdrop, this postcard-perfect Main Street is on the National Register of Historic Places, along with the nearby courthouse and railroad district.

7 MEDICINE LODGE ARCHAEOLOGICAL SITE: Deep within the beautiful Bighorn Mountains lies this ancient treasure. Here,

petroglyphs and pictographs dating back 10,000 years cover much of the red sandstone bluff and offer insight into the ancient people who once lived in present-day Wyoming.


8 OCCIDENTAL HOTEL: Really want to feel the spirit of the Wild West's most notorious characters? Check into the Occidental Hotel in Buffalo, where Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid were known to lay their heads.

9 JIM GATCHELL MEMORIAL MUSEUM: At this museum in Buffalo, you'll see wagons that carried pioneers along the trails and discover how their simple wooden wheels and spartan furnishings exemplify the pluck of the pioneers and the hardships they endured.

10 ALADDIN GENERAL STORE: Find Western wear, jewelry and antiques for sale in this century-old store (ask to explore the treasures in the attic!). - » **Edness K. Wilkins State Park:** Edness is a quiet getaway for nature lovers seeking the relaxing effect of cottonwood-shaded terrain, rewarding bird watching, leisurely strolls, canoeing and fishing.
- » **Glendo State Park:** Glendo is a top destination for boating, water skiing, camping and fishing in Wyoming due to the large, serene reservoir smack dab in the middle of the park. Water enthusiasts are also joined by history buffs here — the park holds artifacts and tipi remnants from several American Indian tribes.
- » **Guernsey State Park:** Rocky bluffs create a peaceful haven for swimmers, boaters and water skiers on the Guernsey Reservoir. Visitors can also tour historic buildings built by the Civilian Conservation Corps in the 1930s, including the Guernsey Museum, which is located on top of a cliff that gives way to expansive views of the water.

The North Platte River lazily flows through this long, wide swath of the state. Along its path, Casper, Chugwater, Wheatland, Glendo, Douglas and Glenrock bear evidence of the settlers and emigrants of the Western frontier. From scars in the earth left by wagons on the Oregon Trail to fascinating history museums, you'll discover the heart and soul of the pioneer story in Central Wyoming. CENTRAL REGION OVERVIEW

1 CASPER

The second-largest city in the state, Casper abounds with opportunities for cultural exploration and recreation. You'll find more than 20 museums dedicated to subjects ranging from territorial history and geology to modern art as well as an award-winning symphony and an active theater community. For those looking for outdoor adventures, Casper has it all — world-class fly fishing, hiking, biking, rock climbing, downhill and cross-country skiing, snowmobiling, golfing and more. For a scenic drive, head to the pine-draped summit of Casper Mountain.

2 DOUGLAS

Douglas is a little town with a lot of character and a full schedule of fun events. Known as the "Home of the Jackalope," it hosts the Jackalope Days festival in June (any time of year, head downtown to Jackalope Square and get the lowdown on the mythical creature

that roams Wyoming). Easier to spot and just as fun, the Wyoming State Fair lights up Douglas every August. Just outside of town, visitors can tour Fort Fetterman, a historic army base on the Bozeman Trail. And, 14 miles west of town, don't miss Ayers Natural Bridge, a 100-foot-long rock arch spanning La Prele Creek, 50 feet below.

3 WHEATLAND/ GUERNSEY/CHUGWATER

As a farming community, Wheatland boasts a downtown reminiscent of days gone-by, highlighted by the elegant and stately Platte County courthouse. The town comes alive in the summer months with the Platte County Fair and Rodeo, offering plenty of old-time fun with live music, crafts, barbecue and agricultural events such as tractor pulls and pig wrestling. In nearby Guernsey, you'll find several fascinating historic sites as well as Guernsey State Park, a haven for boating, camping and water skiing. Just south, Chugwater

is famous for their chili — don't miss the annual cookoff held each June.

4 TORRINGTON/LUSK

Wyoming has deep roots in Torrington, which emerged in the 19th century at the crossroads of four historic trails — the Oregon Trail, Mormon Trail, Texas Cattle Route and the Cheyenne-to-Deadwood Stagecoach Route. Today, that history is preserved at the Homesteader Museum. While in town, enjoy views of the North Platte River. To the north, Lusk is a conveniently located hidden gem along the way to Devils Tower. Stop by their historic Stagecoach Museum or take the kids on a digging adventure at the Paleo Park.



DISCOVER PIONEER HISTORY IN CENTRAL WYOMING



Most physical evidence of American pioneers' westward treks has long since been erased. And, in an age of text messaging and ordering pizza with a click of a mouse, it can be a struggle to truly grasp what life was like for them. But in Central Wyoming, the land remains much as it was back then, complete with ruts in the earth left by their wagon wheels. Tour the region's excellent museums and historic sites for a vivid glimpse into 19th-century frontier life.

The **National Historic Trails Interpretive Center** in Casper should top any cultural itinerary in Central Wyoming. Exhibits in the museum realistically document the lives of both emigrants and Native Americans in the pioneer era and invite visitors to "experience history, don't just read about it." Round out your experience with a visit to the nearby **Fort Caspar Museum**, a reconstructed 1865 military post near several historic trails that boasts permanent exhibits on prehistoric cultures, Plains Indians, ranching, emigrant trails and the history of Casper.

Nowhere are the westward journeys of pioneers more palpably felt than at the **Oregon Trail Ruts National Historic Landmark** and **Register Cliff State Historic Site**, just east of Douglas, near Guernsey. The ruts — which are some of the best preserved on the Oregon Trail and cut several feet deep into the sandstone — were made by thousands of wagons on their way to South Pass, a valley that enabled emigrants to cross the Rockies. As emigrants traveled along the trail, they often marked their names and the dates of their journeys in certain places to signal to friends and family traveling later that they had made it that far. Register


Cliff, a sandstone precipice covered with names and dates, is one of the most prominent and is truly a captivating relic of pioneer times.

Continue east of Guernsey to the town of Fort Laramie and **Fort Laramie National Historic Site**. Founded in 1834 by fur trappers and later stationed by troops, the fort was one of the most important in the West. Set at the confluence of the North Platte and Laramie rivers, the post provided emigrants with fresh water, provisions and protection. Today, 22 original structures stand, some of which are restored and open for tours.



DID YOU KNOW? *The University of Wyoming's mascot, the Cowboys, supposedly dates back to 1891, when a rough-n-tough cowboy helped out in a football game against the rival Cheyenne Soldiers. He took the field in a hat and cowboy shirt, enticing a distracting yell of "Hey, look at the Cowboy!" The university now has one of the most unique and recognizable logos in college athletics.*





FISH TALES

THE MIRACLE MILE & BEYOND

In Central Wyoming, near Casper, the cool waters of the **North Platte River** murmur and glisten between wide, rocky banks, making adventure-hungry trout fishers practically salivate. That's because the river boasts two legendary, blue-ribbon tail waters: The **Miracle Mile** and **Grey Reef** sections consistently produce trophy rainbows, browns and cutthroats.

What sets these sections of the North Platte apart from other fishing destinations? "That tug on the line when a monster trout bites the hook. These trout are big, strong and will put up the fight of a lifetime," says local angler Jeff McDonald. "Abundant food sources, little fishing pressure, cold and consistent water, and access to the lake below" create the ideal environment.

To make the most of a fishing excursion on "the Mile," as it's called, or the Grey Reef, consider contacting an outfitter or guide to take you out on the river. You can also visit fishcasper.com for fishing reports and information.

Central Wyoming's other two hot spots for fishing include the **Alcova** and **Pathfinder Reservoirs**. Massive walleye — called "the lobster of the Rockies" — as well as trout and carp, thrive in the reservoirs' habitats. For those who enjoy lake fishing, these two scenic bodies of water present unparalleled opportunities to reel in the big one.

TIPS FOR FISHING THE MILE



- » Because of its status as a spawning ground, be careful not to walk through the redds (spawning areas) or you could disturb or destroy the eggs.
- » The Mile is relatively remote. Bring everything you might need.
- » Weather can be unpredictable. Dress in layers and bring waterproof outerwear.
- » When wading, be careful not to slip on the algae-covered rocks on the riverbed.
- » Fishing can be good virtually any time of year here, but is especially great when rainbows spawn in the spring and browns spawn in the fall.

HISTORIC SITES

CALIFORNIA TRAIL

California Trail follows the same route as the Oregon and Mormon trails until it diverges from the Mormon Trail and the Oregon Trail. Today, trail ruts and other traces can still be seen for more than 1,000 miles from Casper to California.

CHEROKEE TRAIL

Gold fever hit the Cherokee Indians as hard as it did the rest of the country. In 1849 and 1850, many Cherokees left their reservation in Oklahoma and headed west to seek their fortunes in the California gold fields.

NEZ PERCE TRAIL

Glendo
The Nez Perce Trail is more than 1,170 miles long and was used only once in its entirety. The portion of the trail that passes through Wyoming bisects the northwestern corner of the state at Yellowstone National Park and Sunlight Basin.

OREGON TRAIL

During the mass overland emigration by covered wagon that began in 1841, the mountain man's pathway along the North Platte and Sweetwater rivers to South Pass would be known by many names.



»» **Curt Gowdy State Park:** This easily accessible park near Cheyenne and Laramie is a mountain biker's paradise, with varied terrain for beginners and experts alike. Consider reserving an overnight stay at nearby Hynds Lodge, listed on the National Register of Historic Places, for a humble family or group gathering.

»» **Seminole State Park:** Seminole sits about 30 miles northeast of Rawlins and has plenty of opportunities to spot bighorn sheep, elk, deer, coyotes and pronghorn. Explore 180 miles of shoreline along one of Wyoming's largest reservoirs and set up camp at a site snuggled beneath the beautiful Seminole Mountains.

Many visitors come to this region of the state to experience Cheyenne Frontier Days, but once here, they discover the Southeast is brimming with cultural and recreational opportunities. This region has numerous historic attractions, and its sprawling state parks, picturesque mountain ranges and reservoirs perfect for boating and fishing mean there's an abundance of fun to be had outdoors. SOUTHEAST REGION OVERVIEW

1 CHEYENNE

Cheyenne, the state capital and largest city, is known for its friendly people and Old West vibe. You'll find a slew of quintessential Western attractions — even if you can't make it to Frontier Days — as well as stores and museums. Walk the historic streets, grab a bite at a down-home café or try on an authentic pair of cowboy boots. And be sure to keep an eye out for the city's trademark eight-foot-tall cowboy boots painted by local artists.

2 LARAMIE

Set at the foot of the gorgeous Snowy Range of the Medicine Bow Mountains (known locally as the Snowies), Laramie is a quaint college town with plenty of cultural, shopping and dining options. As the home of the University of Wyoming, Laramie hosts a constant schedule of sporting, cultural and artistic events. Its popular football and basketball teams give locals and visitors plenty

to cheer for, and the UW Art Museum has exhibits and courses for visitors of all ages and interests.

3 SARATOGA

Whether it's mountain biking, hiking, camping or blue-ribbon trout fishing, recreation is the name of the game in Saratoga. Nestled in the Platte Valley between the Sierra Madre Range and the Medicine Bow (Snowy) Range, Saratoga is a great place to stay while exploring the nearby wilderness areas. Don't miss the Hobo Hot Pool, the ultimate (and free) spot to relax after your adventures.



4 RAWLINS

Rawlins is a friendly little town immersed in frontier history. It was founded in the 1860s along the new Union Pacific Railroad route across Wyoming. Outlaws frequented the town throughout the rest of the century, and there are many opportunities in present-day Rawlins to

learn about the colorful and notorious characters that shaped the early history of Wyoming. Nearby, you'll find the Washakie Trail, which crosses the Continental Divide close to Rawlins. Don't miss a visit to The Wyoming Frontier Prison, the original state penitentiary, open from 1901-1981.



DON'T MISS THE DADDY OF 'EM ALL



Cheyenne Frontier Days began in 1897 as a humble affair, but it has since turned into the largest outdoor rodeo and Western celebration in the world. Every July, visitors get a true taste of the Old West as the “Daddy of ‘Em All” delivers 10 days of thrilling PRCA rodeo competition, down-home food and world-class entertainment (past performers include Tim

McGraw, Brad Paisley and Lady Antebellum). The event draws numerous contestants, including some of the nation’s top rodeo cowboys, all vying for a piece of the million-dollar purse — the largest regular-season payoff in pro rodeo.

Besides bucking broncs and nightly concerts, Frontier Days features a carnival, merchants selling everything from

elaborate silver belt buckles to huckleberry barbecue sauce, and even some late-night line dancing. Mark your calendars for this year’s event, which will be kicking up dust July 17–26, 2015 — and be sure not to miss the CBR World Championships (Championship Bull Riding!) July 20 and 21. Riders will compete for the title in a thrilling display of strength and stamina.

“I’ve been to rodeos before, but nothing has compared to the Daddy of ‘Em All. From I-25 you can see the bright lights and colors of the carnival and the tops of the teepees in the Indian Village. When you pull into the dusty parking lot, there are pickup trucks and horses occupying every other space — yes, horses have their own parking spaces. The midway is packed with fair-style food vendors selling funnel cakes topped with ice cream, smoked turkey legs and corn dogs. Once you smell it all, you won’t be able to resist.”

If you're planning on setting up basecamp for your Wyoming vacation in either Cheyenne or Laramie, you'll easily be able to access the best of Southeast Wyoming. Easy daylong jaunts to gorgeous national forest land, historic sites and fascinating monuments mean a chance to expand your experience with an exciting regional itinerary. The following are a few great day-trip options.



1 MEDICINE BOW NATIONAL FOREST

From Laramie: 30 min

From Cheyenne: 90 min

Perhaps one of the best-kept secrets in the Southwest, Medicine Bow National Forest is arguably every bit as gorgeous as Grand Teton National Park — but less traveled, and therefore more pristine, with glacier-fed lakes, scenic overlooks, sparkling waterfalls and old mining camps. In the forest's Snowy Mountain range, peaks rise to 12,000 feet and dip into 6,000-foot valleys, creating a dramatic landscape that will have you snapping away with your camera. Take a spectacular drive on the Snowy Range Scenic Byway (June through mid-November); admire the famously photogenic Marie and Mirror lakes; or take advantage of the area's outstanding winter recreation opportunities. Mountain bikers and other recreation seekers traveling between Cheyenne and Medicine Bow will want to make a stopover at the Curt Gowdy State Park.



2 WYOMING TERRITORIAL PRISON STATE HISTORIC SITE

From Laramie: In Laramie

From Cheyenne: 50 min

This 1872 prison is rich with tales of its "violent and desperate outlaws," the most famous of which was Butch Cassidy. And after the prison closed, it became a center for scientific experimentation by the University of Wyoming, a legacy that can be explored in the "Science on the Range" exhibit.

3 AMES MONUMENT

From Laramie: 30 min

From Cheyenne: 45 min

The Ames Monument is a pyramidal structure built in 1882 to honor brothers Oliver and Oakes Ames, two Union Pacific Railroad financiers who were implicated in a major funding scandal. Whether the curious structure was erected as a railroad PR tactic or a true tribute to the brothers is up for debate. The pyramid was designed by notable American architect Henry Hobson Richardson.

4 VEDAUWOO

From Laramie: 15 min

From Cheyenne: 30 min

Known to the Arapaho Indians as "Land of the Earthborn Spirit," the rock formations of Vedauwoo (pronounced vee-da-woo) attract experienced climbers, campers and hikers. This area is conveniently located off Interstate 80 between Cheyenne and Laramie (exit 329) and for westbound travelers is their first introduction to the Medicine Bow-Routt National Forest and its more than 2 million acres of public lands.

MAIN STREETS NOT TO MISS

Experience the charm, history and friendliness of the downtown districts that are spread throughout Wyoming's Southeast region. Most date all the way back to frontier days, when transcontinental travelers saw this beautiful land and set up camp — permanently. The century-old courthouses, mercantiles and saloons still welcome travelers today, and thanks to the Wyoming Main Street project, they will for centuries more to come. These local towns have invested in restoring and preserving their central business districts and are all worthwhile stops on your trip to Southeast Wyoming.

RAWLINS

Timeless brick buildings line the sidewalks in Rawlins, the Western town that sprouted up around a 19th-century train stop. Browse railroad history at the **Train Depot**, see local artists at the **Rawlins Main Street Gallery** and shop for gifts in quaint boutiques. Stroll through downtown to view the 12 murals that tell the colorful history of Carbon County. Don't miss the **Wyoming Frontier Prison**, the historic (and supposedly haunted) penitentiary three blocks off Main Street.

SARATOGA

This historic downtown consists of just a couple of blocks chock full of antique retail stores and restaurants. Of particular interest is **Lollypops** — a quaint ice cream parlor decorated like a 1950s soda fountain — and **Shively Hardware Company**, where if you purchase rope, they still pull it up from the basement through a hole in the floor. Most stores still have their original storefronts, and the shops that have chosen to renovate are voluntarily taking on an Old Western look.

Stop in at **Black Hawk Gallery**, where you will be welcomed with true Wyoming hospitality and can see artwork ranging from sculpted bronze pieces to Western oil paintings.

LARAMIE

From its boom-town roots, Laramie has flourished into a cultural center as the home of the **University of Wyoming**, but it still maintains its Old West spirit from the days when it was known as "The Gem City of the Plains." Learn the stories of its lawless beginnings by picking up a walking tour brochure at the Laramie Area Visitor Center, Main Street Alliance or the Chamber of Commerce. Along your route, see the landmark **Kuster Hotel**, the historic **Women's History House** and the beautifully ornate **St. Matthew's Church**. Finally, wet your whistle at the many locally owned downtown restaurants and watering holes.


STATE PARK

SOUTHWEST REGION OVERVIEW

1 ROCK SPRINGS Rock Springs delivers an excellent mix of indoor and outdoor wonders. You'll find cultural gems such as the Community Fine Arts Center, which houses works by world-famous artists such as Norman Rockwell and Grandma Moses, and the Rock Springs Historical Museum. The town is near the Killpecker Sand Dunes, North America's largest active dunes, and the stunning Boar's Tusk, as well as the Red Desert.

2 GREEN RIVER The town of Green River sprang up around the river of the same name even before the railroad came through. It's now a haven for outdoor fun such as fishing, canoeing and kayaking. Green River makes a great base for exploring the nearby treasures of Flaming Gorge National

Recreation Area and Seedskaadee National Wildlife Refuge, home to antelope, moose, mule deer and a variety of birds.

3 EVANSTON Encircled by mountains, Evanston offers many kinds of recreational opportunities, including fishing, hiking, mountain biking and camping. In town, visit the Joss House, an 1894 Taoist temple that served as a place of worship for the large Chinese community that once lived here. Don't miss visiting the Fort Bridger State Historic Site (between Evanston and Green River), an 1843 trading post for pioneers and miners.

4 KEMMERER A cowboy town with a prehistoric past, Kemmerer is authentically Western. It's just 10 minutes from

Fossil Butte National Monument, a 50-million-year-old lake bed that holds the world's largest deposit of freshwater fossils. Kemmerer hosts two great annual events: Fossil Fest and the Oyster Ridge Music Festival. Be sure to pay a visit to the J.C. Penney Homestead & Historical Foundation, where the famous store began.

5 AFTON As you enter Afton, you'll pass under the world's largest elk-antler arch, a symbol of the town's rural alpine ambiance. At the south end of the verdant Star Valley, there are stunning mountain ranges, biking and hiking trails and a handful of golf courses. Intermittent Springs, found in Swift Creek Canyon east of town, flows for 18 minutes and then suddenly stops for another 18 minutes, making it one of only three periodic springs in the world.



6 PINEDALE Pinedale's thriving ranching industry ensures its Old West character remains in full effect, and working ranches offer lodging and activities such as horseback rides and cattle roundups. On the western slopes of the Wind River Mountain Range and the Bridger Wilderness Area, there's nearby recreation for fishers, picnickers, kayakers, rock climbers, bikers, hunters and skiers. Don't miss the Museum of the Mountain Man, and the CCC Ponds, Fremont Lake, Elkhart Trailhead and the Continental Divide Trail are just minutes away.

FLAMING GORGE NATIONAL RECREATION AREA

Named for the awesome, kaleidoscopic colors of the natural landscape, this recreation area comprises more than 201,000 acres of scenic land surrounding Flaming Gorge Reservoir. It is truly a land of living color, with many rock formations — sculpted through the centuries by wind and water — changing colors and perspective with the varying sun. Fed by the waters of the Green River, the reservoir boasts approximately 375 miles of shoreline, ranging from low flats to cliffs more than 1,500 feet high.



DID YOU KNOW? *Flaming Gorge Reservoir is famous for its huge trophy lake trout. The largest on record topped the scale at 52 pounds, but 20-pounders are caught regularly.*

FOSSIL BUTTE NATIONAL MONUMENT

Imagine Southwest Wyoming with a wet, subtropical climate. That seems nothing like the dry desert landscape that stretches across the region now, but it was indeed the case in prehistoric times. See the incredible evidence at Fossil Butte National Monument, one of the richest fossil hotbeds in the world. In the footprint of a 50-million-year-old lake bed, fossilized fish, insects, reptiles, plants, birds and mammals tell the story of ancient life in a subtropical landscape and give visitors a new perspective on Wyoming's long history.

The monument is about 16 miles west of Kemmerer on U.S. 30 (about 85 miles northwest of the town of Green River).



5 FREE THINGS TO DO IN SOUTHWEST WYOMING

Southwest Wyoming is filled with beautiful rock formations, fun recreational activities, scenic byways and intriguing fossilized remains. It is a spectacular region to visit — all without breaking the bank.

1 MARVEL AT THE WHITE MOUNTAIN PETROGLYPHS IN WYOMING'S RED DESERT

Located approximately 26 miles northeast of Rock Springs, the White Mountain Petroglyphs are one of the state's premier rock art sites. The site includes stone etchings of figures portraying bison and elk hunts, geometric forms and tiny footprints — all etched into the stone some 200 to 1,000 years ago. The petroglyphs also illustrate contact with European cultures in the form of horse and warrior etchings. It's truly an incredible glimpse into history and is free to all visitors.

2 CHECK OUT MOUNTAIN MAN, NATIVE AMERICAN AND MINING ARTIFACTS AT THE FOSSIL COUNTRY FRONTIER MUSEUM IN KEMMERER

This museum hosts a collection of natural and cultural materials representative of the history-rich area. The museum's goal is to educate the public about the area's history and culture, and in doing so, does not charge for admission. A sampling of annual exhibits includes the J.C. Penney Mother store, bootlegging stills and wine presses and a replica coal mine.

3 DRIVE THE PILOT BUTTE WILD HORSE SCENIC LOOP TOUR, BETWEEN ROCK SPRINGS AND GREEN RIVER

Winding north of Rock Springs and Green River is the Pilot Butte Wild Horse Scenic Loop, a 23-mile long, hard-packed gravel road that passes between beautiful rock formations and bottomless cliffs. If you're lucky, you'll spot a pack of the magnificent wild horses that roam the area, but even if you don't, the spectacular scenery is worth the drive.

4 VISIT THE EXCELLENT GALLERY AT THE COMMUNITY FINE ARTS CENTER IN ROCK SPRINGS

The CFAC is one of Wyoming's artistic treasures, housing works by Norman Rockwell, Grandma Moses and other important 20th-century artists in its permanent collection. The museum boasts close to 500 original American paintings, prints and photographs — in addition to changing displays of fine art throughout the year.

5 HIKE THROUGH SEEDSKADEE NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE FOR THE CHANCE TO SPOT AN AMAZING ROSTER OF WILDLIFE

Protecting approximately 27,230 acres of riparian, wetland and upland shrub habitats along the Green River, the refuge could easily set the scene for a perfect nature walk. Count how many bird species you see (there are 220), and keep an eye out for bald eagles, trumpeter swans, moose, mule deer, white-tailed jackrabbits, coyotes, foxes and more.





Near Kemmerer there are several private quarries — for example, the Fossil Safari — where you can dig for fish fossils in the Green River Formation. Wyoming has tons of fossils on public land, but if you find something good on public land you can’t keep it — it belongs to the public. Not so at the private quarries, unless they’ve made their own rules about ownership. So if you’re concerned about keeping your Wyoming fossil, check the rules at your site of choice before you dig.”

A WORD WITH WYOMING'S CRAIG JOHNSON

The *New York Times* bestselling author is a long-time Wyoming resident whose popular Longmire series follows Sheriff Walt Longmire through fictional Absaroka County. *Any Other Name*, the 10th book in the series, debuted in May 2014.

Q Tell us why Ucross, and Wyoming in general, became your home base.

Craig Johnson: I delivered horses down here 25 years ago for a rancher I was working for in Montana and fell in love with Ucross (population 25). It's a tiny town at the base of the Bighorn Mountains at the confluence of Clear and Piney creeks. I built the ranch, pouring the concrete and stacking the logs myself and once I got that done I sat down and wrote the first in the Walt Longmire series, *The Cold Dish*. I think Wyoming provides a peace and focus for me that no other place can.

Q What parts of the real Wyoming find their way into Absaroka County?

Craig Johnson: Ha, all of it! Seeing as how Absaroka County is the unofficial 24th county of Wyoming, I get to cherry pick from the other 23. One of the benefits of the success of both the books and the television series "Longmire" has been that I get contacted by a lot of sheriffs and deputies who tell me the most amazing stories, some of which I include in the novels.

Q How can visitors experience Longmire's Wyoming (hopefully without coming upon any dead bodies or towns without pity)?

Craig Johnson: Well, it's no secret that I squeezed Absaroka County between Sheridan and Johnson County where I live. Both Buffalo (aka: Durant) and Sheridan figure largely in the books, along with the Big-

horn Mountains and the Powder River Country. I think north-central Wyoming is the most beautiful place in the world. An awful lot of people miss it when they're traveling between the Black Hills and Yellowstone, but I would advise them to take the time to explore the Bighorns.

Q *Spirit of Steamboat* has been named the first One Book Wyoming read and *Death Without Company* was the Wyoming Historical Association's Book of the Year. What does it mean to have your work so embraced by fellow Wyomingites?

Craig Johnson: It's a high-context relationship I have with the readers of Wyoming — people all over appear to love the books, but they don't live here so they're not experts. I think the people of Wyoming recognize the characters and locations in my novels and realize I'm trying to do something more than just stack up bodies like cord wood.

Q What do you think the biggest misconception of Wyoming is?

Craig Johnson: When I'm on tour I sometimes get the remark, "Boy, Walt Longmire sure is smart for a Wyoming sheriff." I'm not sure which part of that statement I take umbrage with first ... I don't think that people think we're particularly dumb, just unsophisticated.

Q And how do you think the Longmire novels add something new to that conversation?

Craig Johnson: I think Walt is a pretty good example of what I consider to be the best qualities of Wyoming — he's smart, he's tough, he's kind, he's decent and he cares. The books are on the *New York Times* bestsellers list and the A&E series is showing in 200 countries. I was a little worried about being responsible for the image that the country and the world have of Wyoming, but we could have worse ambassadors than Walt Longmire.

Q Did seeing *Absaroka* come to life through A&E's TV adaptation change the way you approach the novels and your characters in any way?

Craig Johnson: Not really. "Longmire" [was] the highest rated scripted drama in A&E's network history and it's wonderful, but I was writing the books for seven years before Hollywood found me and I'll be writing those characters long after they're gone.


Q What travel recommendations do you make to friends or family visiting Wyoming?

Craig Johnson: The Cloud Peak Wilderness Area in the heart of the Bighorn Mountains, almost 300 square miles without roads, motor vehicles or electricity — that's my idea of heaven.

Q *Any Other Name* was released last May. Any tantalizing details to share about what's next for fans who can't wait for more?

Craig Johnson: Well, there's a collection of all the Walt Longmire short stories [that came out in October 2014] with the title *Wait for Signs*; and then in May 2015, the 11th in the series will hit the stands — it's called *Dry Bones* and deals with dinosaurs...

Editor's note: Shortly after the interview was conducted, A&E canceled its TV adaptation of "Longmire"; as of press time, producers were looking to have it picked up by another network.
